198 units of the Ceramic Water Filter sponsored by T&E Solutions was distributed to 9 elementary schools in Davao, Philippines. For this delivery, 100 For All provided WASH training to students, teachers, mayors and Barangay authorities in operation and maintenance. These filters are be utilized by teachers, students and the local community who source their water from the school. The Ceramic Water Filters typically last 3 to 5 years with proper maintenance and 100 For All will be providing annual quality assurance testing with all of the schools.

Solution Details



Ceramic pot filters are made from porous fired clay pots nested within a plastic container. The clay is painted with colloidal silver to help inactivate pathogens. Water is poured into the ceramic pot and collected underneath in a container with a tap at the bottom. This system provides safe storage for the treated water and blocks anything larger than a water molecule, allowing only water to pass through the pores. When a ceramic water filter is treated with colloidal silver, it can further prevent bacteria and the growth of mold and algae in the body of the filter. These filters provide 99% safety from all organic pathogens and bacteria.



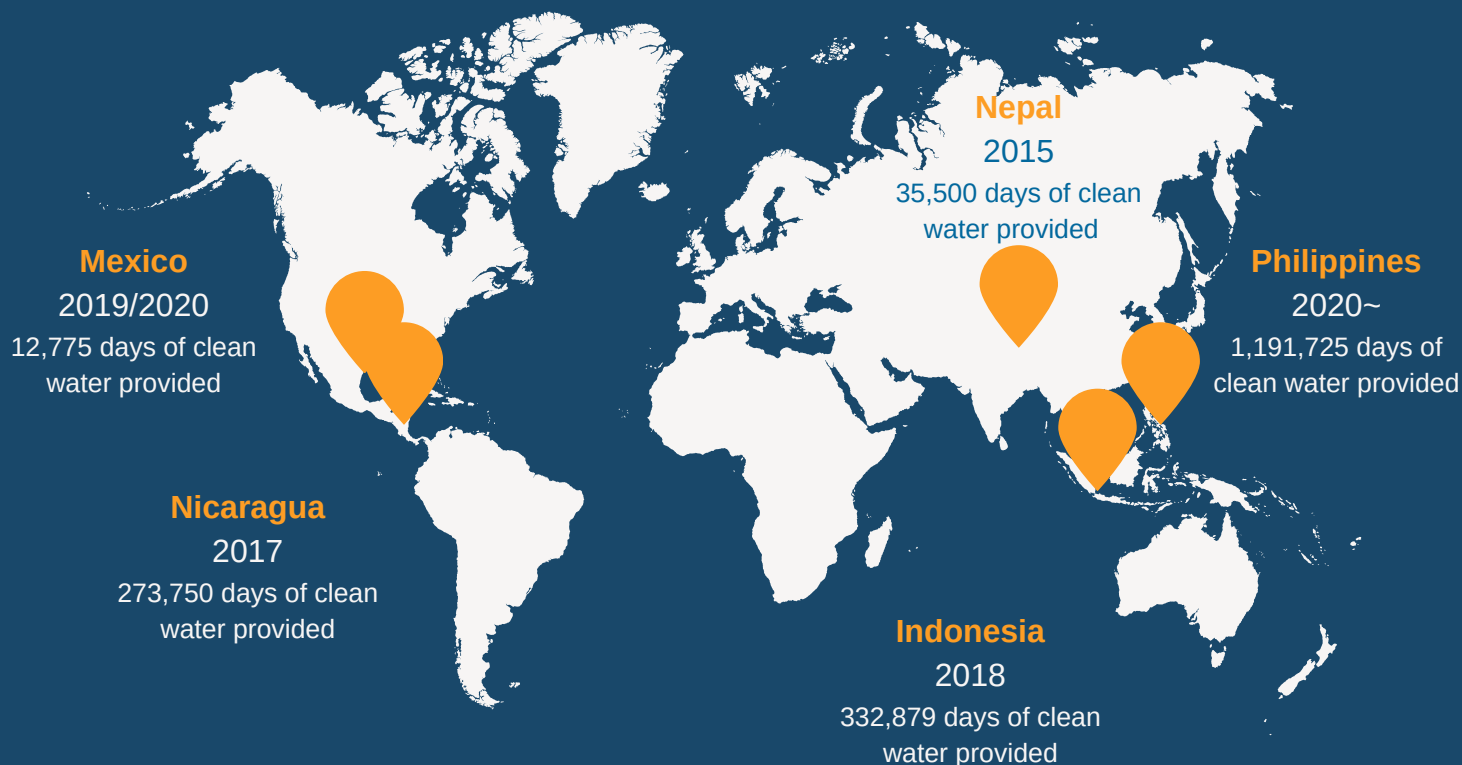
